'Shot From the Sky' Exhibit to Be Displayed in Long Beach Jan. 5 to 7

Largest display of captured enemy aerial equipment ever presented, the Army Air Forces' "Shot From the Sky" exhibit will open a three-day appearance in Bixby Park, Long Beach, Jan. 5, AAF officials here announced today.

The 10-acre exhibit, which is entirely free to the public, is sponsored in Long Beach by the Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with the national war agencies and the Naval Drydocks to recruit manpower for war jobs and to encourage war workers to stay on their jobs.

Theme of the exhibit is "Get a War Job and Stay on Your Job to Finish the Job." All major war industries and military installations in the Long Beach area will present exhibits in connection with the displays of captured aircraft, and recruiting booths will be maintained by the United States employment service, the War Manpower Commission and the Civil Service Commission.

Exhibit hours will be from 2 until 10 p.m., Jan. 5, 6, and 7. Stage performances, featuring Hollywood stars and local civilian and military orchestras, will

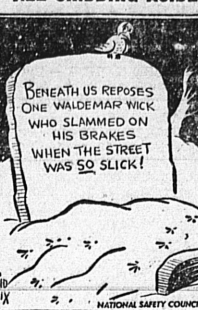
be presented from the largest portable stage in the country each evening at 7:30 o'clock and each afternoon at 3:30 o'clock. No admission is charged for the stage performances.

"Shot From the Sky" includes almost 10,000 pieces of captured axis warplanes and features three planes still in flying condition—a Junkers 88 medium bomber captured in the Mediterranean theater, a Jap Zero captured at Buna and a Messerschmitt 109 fighter taken at an African airfield.

Shown for the first time in the United States is a Nazi rocket bomb captured on Normandy's rocket coast. One of Hitler's V-1 vengeance weapons used against London and the south of England last summer, the buzz bomb is accompanied by explanatory charts and diagrams.

Other display pieces include a Jap "Oscar" pursuit ship and fuselage of a JU-88, ME-110, Focke-Wulf 190, Jap Mitsubishi "Betty" bomber, ME-110, and wings, engines, propellers, tail sections and landing gears of almost every type of German and Japanese fighters and bombers.
