Private First Class Joe Bilich of Torrance, Calif, has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for heroic achievements against the enemy in the Philippines by Lieutenant General Walter Kruger, commander of the Sixth Army. Bilich, now recuperating in a hospital from wounds received in the action, was with the 6th Ranger Battalion when that unit landed on three, small islands guarding the approaches to Leyte Island three days before General Krueger's Sixth Army made the main landing on Leyte. The Rangers' mission was to destroy Japanese look-out stations on those islands so that the main invasion force could approach the beaches undetected.

Billeh landed on Dinigat Island with his company. "After a five-hour forced march the patrol of which Private First Class Billich was a member, sealed a 300-foot cliff and came out on a parapet only 30 feet from the enemy occupied buildings to be taken," read his citation.

# In France: Gets Purple Heart

Cpi. Rudolf K. Bernasconi, who was drafted into the army in March, 1943, is now stationed somewhere in France.

When Cpl. Bernasconi was in Germany he was injured while in his fox-hole when he was hit by the remains of a mortar shell which had exploded on some logs just above him. The concussion knocked him unconscious and paralyzed the muscles in his back. He was awarded the Purple Heart for his gallantry.

Born in Geneva, Switzerland, he came to America at the age of four and continued his civilian days in California. Cpl. Bernasconi started school at the Greenfield grammar school and later went to King City high school.

Corporal Bernasconi had his primary training at Fort Riley, Kansas, and instructed at Fort Mead, Maryland. He was then shipped to France, Belgium and Germany, where his accident occurred. He is now in a hospital in France.
