New Red and Blue Stamps Good Jan. 28

Six more red stamps will be good on Sunday, Jan. 28, for obtaining meats, fats and five more blue stamps will become valid Thursday, Feb. 1 for buying rationed canned goods, Paul Barksdale, 4000 OPA district ration chief, announced today.

Since the February rationing period will last five weeks, six red stamps are being allocated instead of the five usually issued for four week ration periods. The new red stamps will be Y5, Z5, A2, B2, C2 and D2. Each are good for 10 points—a total of 60 points for the five weeks.

New blue stamps will be H2, J2, K2, L2 and M2, a total of 50 points.
