

## Auto License Business Heavy, Say Authorities

At the half-way point in the license renewal period, three times as many motorists have applied for their one black-and-white license plate as compared with the same period last year, according to authorities.

With two full weeks left until the Feb. 5 deadline, a 200 per cent increase in renewals has been reported. Motorists seem anxious to dress up their cars with their first new plates since 1941.

Aside from the popularity of the new plates, increased registration indicates that there are more cars in California than there were last year, in spite of the fact that no new automobiles are being made. Registration totals are expected to exceed 1944 figures.

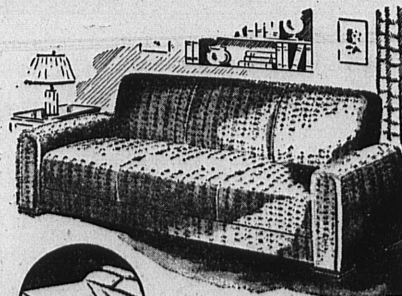
