12 Families Here Use Visiting **Nurse Service**

Twelve Torrance families used the visiting nurse since

Twelve Torrance families have used the visiting nurse since the opening of that service on Jan. 15, it is announced by the Torrance Service Center.

Many of the calls have been for care of patients released early from hospitals, due to the shortage of hospital beds. One call came from a mother who went home from the hospital three days after the birth of her baby. Both mother and child are being cared for daily by the visiting nurse. Another patient was discharged early from the hospital following an operation and is now having daily dressings by the visiting nurse. In these cases the paptients receive expert bedside nursing on an hourly basis, at a small fee, and in each instance the nurse carries out the orders of the family physician.

Some calls are being received from the welfare departments of certain industries, who provide Visiting Nurse Association services for their employees, through an insurance plan.

Any Torrance family may receive a call the same day from the visiting nurse by telephoning Torrance 1405 before 9:30 a. m.
