ws: "It shall be unlawful for any corporation to "It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to burn refuse of any description in an open unattended fire with-in the City of Torrance, or to burn refuse within fifteen (15) feet of any building or outbuild-ings unless the same be enclosed in an enclosure of one inch wire mesh, or to burn any such re-fuse nearer than (en (10) feet to any such building or outbuild-ing, or to burn any refuse in such enclosure at any time of day except between surise and 10:00 a, m, and between 4:30 p. m, and sunset."
