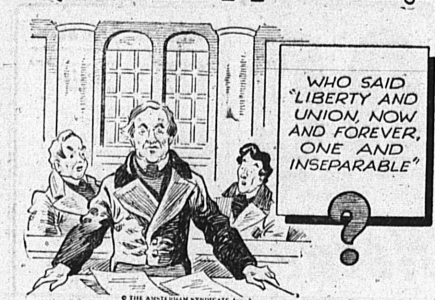

Jesus knew, as others did not, that it was not matter, but mortal mind, whose touch called for aid. Repeating his inquiry, he was answered by the faith of a sick woman. His quick apprehension of this mental call illustrated his spirituality."

## Pueblo Area Improvement, Rotary Aim

A project to furnish recreation and generally improved living conditions in the Pueblo section of Torrance has been launched by the Torrance Area Welfare Council, advisory body here for the Area War Chest and Torrance Service Center.

President Otto B. Willett of the Torrance Rotary Club has taken the lead in initiating programs to aid in this cause, with a view to enlisting the facilities of all civic clubs, fraternal organizations, industry, commerce and citizens to round up the program.

President Willett has appointed the international service committee, headed by James L. Lynch and the community service committee, headed by Hillman R. Lee, to serve.

"The chief need of our Spanish-American population is adequate recreational facilities," stated Lynch, "and we are attempting to obtain necessary funds through donations and through the medium of the various activities of the service and fraternal bodies to pay for the erection of a suitable building and the furnishings and fixtures."

The City of Torrance recently took an option on the purchase of two lots in the Pueblo section and voted to aid in the improvement of the village in the matter of installing sewers, cleaning the roads and alleys and helping in many minor ways.

Mrs. Mary Eggleston of the Torrance Service Center, will be chairman of the speakers bureau to advise the clubs and organizations regarding the project.

"The Mexican consul will address the Rotary Club in the near future and outline how we can best serve the local Mexican element, and a plan to have the Aztec Club put on a play will be consummated by the Rotary committees," Willett said. Donations have been started and checks should be made payable to the Rotary Pueblo fund and

sent to Judge Willett, 1313 Sartori ave.

The Retail Merchants division of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, meeting Monday noon at Christy's Cafe, endorsed the Pueblo district improvement plan after its presentation by Chairman Lee, who heads both the merchants group and the Torrance Area Welfare Council.
