A spelling bee has been planned by the Torrance Rotary Club for the students of Torrance high school. Preliminary spelling bees will be held in each English and Senior Problem classes. The three best from each room will compete at a special assembly to be held at the high school auditorium, on March 13 for the Junior High, and March 14 for the Senior High. The winners of this contest, for the Junior and Senior High, will receive \$10.00 in War Stamps, while the second best will receive \$5.00 worth of War Stamps.

The girl and boy who come in highest from each will compete at the finals to be held at the Rotary Club meeting March 15. The winner of the finals will have his award increased to a \$25.00 war bond.

Students in the seventh and eighth grade will compete for the Junior High while the ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades will compete for the Senior High. The school management of the project is under the leadership of Leonard Green, teacher of Social Studies who is making up the word lists for the separate contests.

Santa Fe May Get Long Beach Connections

Six-day hearing held in Long Beach by Commissioner Claude Porter of the Interstate Commerce Commission on application of the Santa Fe to extend its lines into Long Beach Harbor adjourned on Oct. 5, 1944. Today Santa Fe officials stated it was their understanding that the interstate Commerce Commission Examiner in his proposed report suggested the commission should by service order provide for a connection enabling the Santa Fe during the present emergency to reach Long Beach over the line of the Southern Pacific.

It is understood that the examiner further suggested the submission by March 1, 1946 by all four railroads serving Long Beach of a plan whereby unified operations of all lines now in effect at Los Angeles Harbor be extended to Long Beach Harbor.

So. California Telephone Gives Red Cross \$130,000

A contribution of \$130,000 to the American Red Cross by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co., and its subsidiaries, Southern California Telephone Co., and Bell Telephone Co., of Nevada, has just been announced by N. R. Powley, president, following approval by the board of directors.

Powley stated that the total contribution will be allocated to the various Red Cross chapters consistent with American Red Cross quotas, applicable to the territory served by the telephone companies.

Equipment Is Ordered Bought For Torrance

Replacement, repair and building of city equipment was authorized by the City Council. The council acted as follows. Appropriated not to exceed \$90.00, plus tax, for purchase of a hydraulic scraper for the Ford Ferguson tractor.

Authorized city clerk to advertise for bids for a 600 gallon oil spreader tank (two-wheel trailer type) for spreading road oil, at a cost of approximately \$1950.00 complete, including the necessary spray bars and accessories.

Appropriated \$322.88 for 1 3/4 Cubic Foot Concrete mixer with engine and two used tires, for Municipal Water District No. 1.

Appropriated \$72.01 for purchase of 1 R. C. I. Air Hammer with five caulking tools and hose whip, for Municipal Water District No. 1.

Appropriated not to exceed \$200.00 for purchase of small tools for Municipal Water District No. 1.

Appropriated not to exceed \$160.00 for an exchange motor for Bus No. 101.

Authorized the purchase, or building, of a low, flat bed, four-wheeled trailer, for hauling the new tandem roller. No costs are available at this time.

Judge Plans to Keep Juveniles Out of Jail

Because present methods of handling juvenile cases are defeating the purpose of rehabilitation under the California Youth Authority, Superior Judge William R. McKay of the Criminal Master Calendar Court has announced plans to keep juveniles out of the county jail pending hearings of their cases.

The new plan involved sending convicted juveniles to either industrial camps or county road camps, rather than to jail. In case of juveniles awaiting decisions of the Youth Authority, offenders will be released without bail to parents or other responsible persons.

There are more than 180 juveniles in the county jail at present.

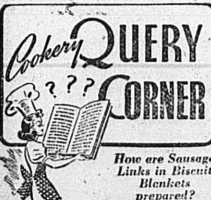
