serving in the Navy on Shore Patrol.

In regard to my accidents, I'll try to go into detail about them. My first visit to the hospital was the day after we took Cherbourg just after landing in France, I was hit by shell fragmentation the first day of the Cherbourg fight and nine days later, I went to the hospital. I wouldn't have gone but my arm got infected and I had a broken blood vessel in my eye so thought I'd better go. I spent three days then. Second time, Aug. 15, while moving up by truck, one of the two and one-half ton trailers that I was riding on turned over and I was thrown off and hit the good old hard ground which will account for my second visit to the hospital for 23 days. I was very lucky as I just had my back and ribs put out of commission, but not too seriously, I ended up with a rib or two broken."


