Only the most essential workers can hereafter qualify as being eligible to purchase new 1942 automobiles, under OPA restrictions announced today by Paul Barksdale d'Orr, OPA district rationing executive.

To conserve the dwindling supply of new cars, the number of classifications of those eligible for purchase certificates was cut from 22 to 8, effective today. All of those removed from the previous eligible list will be eligible to purchase used 1942 cars.

"These restrictions are made necessary by the rapid dwindling away of our stockpile of new cars," d'Orr said. "The entire supply of new cars is now only 10,000.
