Clothing Collection Week Set for April 8 to 14 in Torrance, Says Lee

In every community, the week of April 8-14 inclusive will be designated "CLEAN OUT YOUR CLOTHES CLOSET WEEK" by the United National Clothing Collection which got under way this week in every city and every community in the United States, according to Hillman R. Lee, local chairman for UNCC.

That is the time all Americans are asked to go through their closets and take out serviceable clothing, shoes and even bedding for the people of war-ravaged nations who sorely need to protect their health. Whatever the housewife can find, whether underwear, or outmoded wardrobe, as long as it is in good condition for someone to wear, it will help keep alive someone and bring at least a modicum of comfort as he or she strives to re-establish a new life.

"What would you think if your newly-born child, sister or brother, had nothing more warming or comforting than paper clothing and paper bedding?" asked Lee. "That is the situation government officials have found existing today in many war-devastated lands; many have died from this experience and thousands will suffer and die unless we Americans contribute to the United National Clothing Collection."

Clothes for men, women and

children need not be in perfect condition; but it is necessary that underclothing and cotton garments be washed but need not be ironed. Shoes must be mated and securely tied and piece goods and remnants will be also acceptable.

"What Can You Spare That They Can Wear?" That is the slogan and residents of Los Angeles are asked to contribute a minimum of 5 pounds per person and take them to depots: fire stations, police stations, large post offices, churches, in your community.
