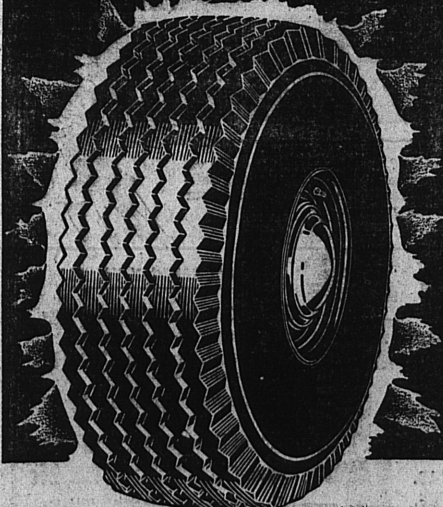

New Idea in Car Theft Fails to Work And Three Men Arrested and Jailed

Something new and different in "perfect crimes" was tried in Torrance during the past week and, as usual, it did not pay. Three men are in custody and a fourth is being sought as a result of the idea.

It all happened, police say, when three Jimenez brothers conceived the idea of hiding a stolen car, after stripping it, by burying the vehicle.

They proceeded to dig a big hole near the place where they were living, and one mistake they made was doing it in broad daylight within sight of Jesus Reyes, a neighbor.

He became suspicious, and called police.

They went to the scene of the "crime" seeking the "body," and they found, carefully buried and hidden with brush and boards, a Willys car, stolen in Redondo Beach from W. C. Seaberg. It had been stripped, and part of the loot was recovered in the Jimenez home, at Torrance blvd. and Althea st.
