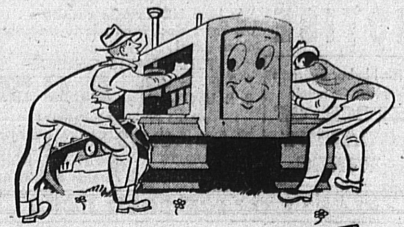
The captain, who has been attached to the hospital staff since its opening 18 months ago, will be gone for seven weeks.

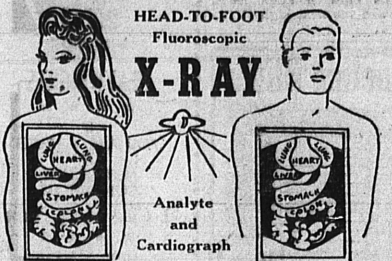
