Lt. V. E. Newman Is Awarded Air Medal

2nd Lt. Virgil E. Newman, pilot, of Torrance, has been awarded the Air Medal, it was announced by Brig. Gen. William H. Tunner, commanding general of the India China Division, Air Transport Command.

The award was made upon completion of 150 hours of operational flight in transport aircraft over the dangerous and difficult India-China air routes, where enemy interception and attack was probable and expected.

The air trail over the Hump, famed route through the towering peaks of the Himalaya Mountains, blazed by the Air Transport Command, is recognized by airmen as the world's toughest. Today the Hump route is the main lifeline of vital military supplies for the Allied forces fighting the Japanese in China.

The citation accompanying the award adds:

"Flying at night as well as by day, at high altitudes over impassable, mountainous terrain through areas characterized by extremely treacherous weather conditions necessitating long periods of operation on instruments, requiring courageous and superior performance of his duties to overcome, he accomplished his mission with distinction."

The award was made for the period of service from October 13, 1944 to December 30, 1944.

Co. H Will Hold Recruiting Drive Here Saturday

Company H, 2nd Battalion, 39th Regiment, California State Guard, will conduct a recruiting campaign in downtown Torrance again this weekend, installing a display of equipment in the window of J. C. Penney Co. store on Sartori ave., according to Captain R. L. Lowellen, commander.

Several pieces of motorized equipment also will be on display on Saturday at the Penney store.

Responding to the appeal from Major General William E. Shedd, commanding general of the Ninth Service Command, and Brig. General Victor R. Hansen, the Adjutant General of California, Captain Lowellen is attempting to build his company up to full strength.

All men not immediately eligible for federal service are asked to join the State Guard. Full G.I. equipment and weapons, including heavy machine guns, are used by the Torrance-Lomita company, with troops receiving full training in their use.

Minor Changes In Processed Food Values

Minor changes in processed foods point values for the ration period beginning April 29 were announced today by OPA.

Point values on 2 cans of snap beans, and one each of tomato, catsup, chili sauce and apricots will be lowered to 10 points, while grape juice will carry a higher value, 50 points for quarts.

In addition, the point value of tomato juice, and vegetable juice combinations containing at least 70 percent tomato juice, will be lowered for the 24-ounce size to 10 points. No other changes are being made in point values for processed foods during the new ration period which extends through June 2.

New Red Stamps Valid as of First of May

Five new red stamps, worth 10 points each for a total of 50 red points, have been validated for the May rationing period. The newly validated red stamps are Q2, R2, S2, T2 and U2. They will be good through August 31.

Simultaneously five new blue points became valid. Each worth 10 points for a total of 50 points, these stamps are Y2, Z2, A1, B1, and C1. These are good to August 31.

Under the so-called 50-50 plan of validation, inaugurated April 1, four sets of both red and blue stamps will be valid at all times. Each set is valid for about four months, with the first set becoming invalid on or about the date the new set is validated.

With the validation of the new red and blue stamps, 10 stamps, five red and five blue, will expire today. These will be: Red T5, U5, V5, W5 and X5; Blue C2, D2, E2, F2 and G2.

While sugar stamp 35 will remain valid up to and including June 2, stamp 36 became due May 1.

Sgt. Morrow Wins Promotion

Sgt. Marshall R. Morrow, son of Mrs. Emma G. Morrow, 1611 W. 26th st., Lomita, Calif., has been promoted to staff sergeant.

Morrow, a squad leader of Company L, 152nd Infantry, Cyclone Division, saw action in his regiment's 16-day battle for strategic and heavily fortified Zig Zag Pass, east of "Olengapo," which opened another route to Manila.

Overseas for 15 months, Morrow served previously in Hawaii, New Guinea, Samar and Leyte.

Fewer Tires in May for Car Owners of Calif.

"Southern California motor car owners are going to have to get along with just 2,547 fewer grade one passenger car tires during May than the total allotted the eight counties making up the Los Angeles district for April."

This information was forthcoming today from Frank L. Ryan, OPA rationing representative.

A total of 32,908 grade one tires will be available in the district the coming month against April's 35,455. Los Angeles county, with April's 24,823 reduced to 23,200 for May, takes the heaviest cut.

RECIPROCAL CARDS

As an experiment in reciprocal relations between the City and County Libraries, the County Council was authorized on Tuesday to prepare a one-year contract with the City of Los Angeles which will abolish the fees charged non-resident patrons by the respective library systems.

The order was made on the motion of Supervisor Darby with the thought that with one year of experimentation the County will be better able to evaluate the merits of such a system of reciprocity.
