Paul's statement to the Romans will be the Golden Text of the Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Mortals and Immortals" in all branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston: "They that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh; but they that are after the Spirit the things of the Spirit."

John's Gospel relates that a nobleman from Capernaum came to Jesus "and besought him that he would come down, and heal his son: for he was at the point of death. . . . Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth. And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way. And as he was now going down, his servants met him, . . . saying, Thy son liveth. . . . Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him. So the father knew that it was at the same hour, in the which Jesus said unto him, Thy son liveth: and himself believed, and his whole house."

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy says, "Jesus never asked if disease were acute or chronic, and he never recommended attention to laws of health, or use of drugs, never prayed to know if God were willing that a man should live. He understood man, whose life is God, to be immortal, and knew that man has not two lives, one to be destroyed and the other to be made indestructible."
