317 Motorists Lose Rations For Violations

Just 317 motorists in the Los Angeles OPA district lost their right to purchase gasoline as a result of revocations and suspensions by rationing board enforcement panels handling ration violations here during the month of April.

The compilation indicated that 274 additional drivers had been warned by board panels to cease asserted violations or face suspension or revocation.

The OPA official pointed out that the current report indicated a considerable slackening off in panel activities. He cited the fact that during the previous month, March, there had been 456 revocations and suspensions listed and 353 warnings given.

Reports of Fishing Given By Division

Reports continue to come in from the wardens of the State Division of Fish and Game regarding fishing in various parts of the state at the opening of the trout season. On the South Fork of the Tule River in the Indian Reservation 93 anglers caught a total of 863 trout. Fishing conditions were called poor here due to high and murky water. On the Middle Fork of the Tule, 44 anglers were checked with 234 trout ranging from five to 14 inches in size.

At Shaver Lake, 63 anglers whose creels were checked caught 10 rainbow trout from 12 1/2 to 18 inches long, and 20 Loch Leven from 14 1/2 to 23 inches.

On tributary streams in the neighborhood of Lake Pillsbury, 175 rainbow were caught by 27 anglers. On Squaw Creek in Shasta County, 18 anglers caught 62 rainbows ranging from six to 17 inches in length. Farnsby Creek in Lassen County provided 121 rainbow and 191 Loch Leven, running in size from six to 20 inches, for 52 fishermen.

On Arrowhead Lake, San Bernardino County, 196 anglers checked on the opening day had caught 544 rainbow, from 9 to 16 inches long.

In Tuolumne County good fishing was reported on Basin Creek and the North Fork of the Tuolumne River.

CSG Will Aid In Memorial Ceremony

Following an invitation from C. Earl Conner, commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars post in Torrance, troops of the 2nd Battalion, 39th Regiment, California State Guard, were ordered to participate in a Memorial parade and ceremony Sunday at 2 p.m. in Torrance.

Capt. Harold Thienhaus, commanding officer of the battalion, said that Lt. Col. A. Milton Fish, commander of Group 3, SA, CSG, had designated Capt. R. L. Lowellen, commanding Co. H, Torrance, as coordinating officer, and Conner, postmaster of Torrance whose VFW post is cooperating with the American Legion and both auxiliary organizations in staging the Sunday memorial program, had designated Captain Lowellen as parade marshal.

The battalion band, organized by Co. A, of Long Beach, Capt. C. C. Church, commander, will play for the parade and ceremony.

Color guards and a firing squad also will be provided by the State Guard units.

Included in the parade will be the Gold Star mothers and fathers of Torrance, American Red Cross units, veterans groups, boy and girl scouts, Minute Men and other patriotic organizations.

A feature of the ceremony will be the dedication by the City of Torrance of a plot of ground in El Prado park to the memory of the boys of Torrance who have given their lives in the cause of liberty.
