## Wilson's Crew Sinks German Sub in Atlantic

Louis J. Wilson, chief commissary steward, of Harbor Hills, Lomita, is a member of the crew of one of four destroyer-escorts which recently trailed and sank a German submarine in Mid-Atlantic. It has been announced by Admiral Jonas Ingram, Commander in Chief, U. S. Atlantic Fleet.

Zigzagging in a long and desperate effort to elude its pursuers, the U-boat finally was blown to pieces in deep water. Debris, oil and personal belongings of the crew—such as a song book and the bowl of a pipe—told the crews of the DE's that their hunt was ended.

Chief Wilson is married to the former Adabelle Smith, daughter of Mrs. B. O. Smith, of Vallejo, Calif. They have two children, Drualla Lee, 13, and Roy L., 7.

## Wm. M. Everett At Amphibious Base in England

William M. Everett, 28, storekeeper, second class, USNR, son of Mr. and Mrs. William L. Everett, 1004 Arlington ave., Torrance, has been serving in a U. S. Navy Amphibious base's engineering and repair division in Portland, England, which helped win victory in Europe by turning out nearly 1,700 repair jobs. Even though he didn't get in to the actual fighting phase of the war, he and several hundred other land-based bluejackets chalked up their own kind of records.

For months on end they worked around the clock to keep the ships in shape so that all Navy commitments could be met. Their jobs included everything from altering a ship's conning tower to changing propellers on small boats.

Most notable feat was the readying of every ship in two task forces for the Normandy invasion, despite air raids and changes in the time schedule. Everett, who joined the Navy in September, 1943, was advanced to his present rating in February. Formerly he was employed by the Columbia Steel Co., in Torrance. He attended Torrance High School.
