Following in the wake of nationwide tightening of the sugar rationing program, Southland housewives will be limited to an issuance of 10 pounds of sugar for home canning purposes, the Office of Price Administration said today.

The order was issued last weekend in San Francisco by OPA Regional Administrator Charles Baird, and applies to not only California, but Arizona, Nevada, Oregon, Washington and northern Idaho.

In commenting on the regional order, Paul Barksdale of Orr, Southland OPA ration chief, said "This cut will assure every family of receiving some sugar for canning purposes."

"Later in the canning season if the 10 pound allotment does not consume all of the probable supply, we hope to issue additional home canning sugar." D'Orr also pointed out that the decrease to 10 pounds per person had brought the family per-capita quota down to 80 pounds. This means that family units up to eight persons may obtain a maximum of 80 pounds.

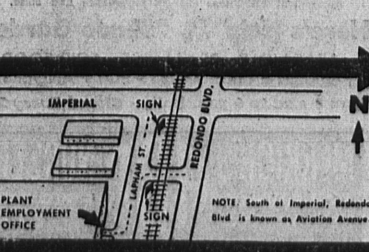

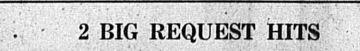
