And he took his staff in his hand, and chose him five smooth stones out of the brook, . . . and his sling was in his hand; . . . Then said David to the Philistine, Thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield; but I come to thee in the name of the Lord of hosts, . . . whom thou hast defied. . . . And David smote the Philistine in his forehead, . . . and he fell upon his face to the earth."

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy writes, "Matter and Mind are opposites. . . . If one is real, the other must be unreal." Only by understanding that there is but one power—not two powers, matter and Mind—are scientific and logical conclusions reached.

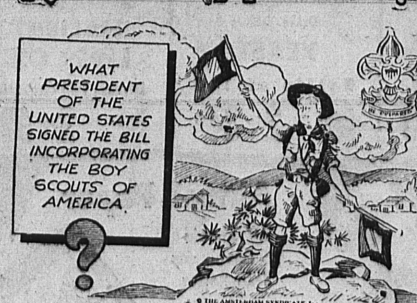
