Priority List While the amount of used fat collected and turned in by one housewide may seem a small contribution to America's vast war effort is is this contribution multiplied millions of times that prevents the nation's vital fat supply from reaching disastrous depletion said M. A. Sloan, Dis-trict Director, Office of Supply. U.S. Department of Agriculture. Today, more than ever, house-hold fats are vitally needed in the manufacture of war mater-ials and civilian good. The responsibility is being shifted more and more, Sloan said, on housewives who are al-ready doing a tremendous joh in reaching the 250,000,000 pound used fats goal for this year. "The 'reduction in output of many civilian items announced recently was necessary because the nation's stoakpile of used fats is at present lower than in the past two years," Sloan said. "No relief is in sight until Pa-elfic sources of fat supply are again producing."

"There can be no let up in the saving and collecting of fats now, and housewives cooperat-ing in the program must save every drop. If this is done patri-otically our goal will be reached," Sloan said. For every pound of used fats turned in, housewives will continue to re-eelve up to four cents in cash and two red ration points.

Dy Legislature A survey of all school districts in the state to determine the advisability of unifying various districts is provided for in a bill signed by Governor Warren. The measure, by Assembly-man Gardiner Johnson, Berke-ley, developed from the state-wide education report made by Dr. George Strayer of New York City. It creates a commission of school districts to consist of the superintendent of public instruc-tion or his appointee and eight lay members appointed by the governor.
