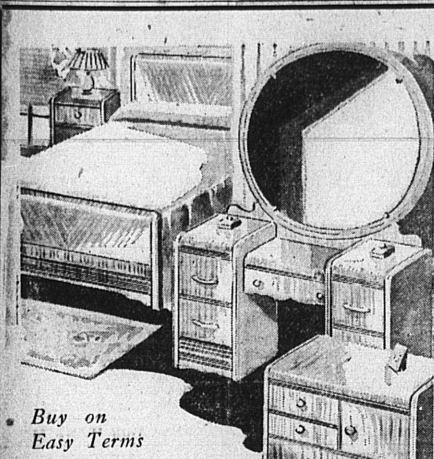

Torrance Man Dies Leaving Cash in House

Morris G. Fay, 52, died at his chicken ranch home at 17506 Arlington ave., Tuesday, and police upon investigation found nearly \$2500 in cash, bonds and savings certificates in his home. Fay and young Richard Frizell, 15, of Gardena, had been working together on the chicken ranch stocked with some 6000 fowl. After lunch, Fay decided to take a rest, and when he failed to reappear, Richard investigated. Finding Fay dead in bed, he called police, who summoned Stone and Myers ambulance.

It was found that Fay died of natural causes.
