

The seedbed can be tempo-rarily covered with newspaper, boards, tar paper, or any other impervious material for the pur-pose of holding the moisture around the seeds. These cover-ings must be removed immedi-ately when the little plants ap-pear at the ground level. If furrows are used to wet the seedbed, the water level should be about two inches be-low the seed. Water should be held in the furrows long enough so that the soli around the seed is wet. The surface of the soli should no be flooded, Organic mulch can be used over the seed with furrow irrigation.

REMOVING FRUIT. STAINS Directions for removing fruit stains, follow: For wool, silk and rayon — Fill bowl with steam-ing hot water; add a few drops of dramonic sparsed ctained area

Ing hot water; add a few drops of ammonia; spread stained por-tion of fabric over bowl; apply hydrogen peroxide from a medi-bine dropper at intervals of about five minutes. (Test an un-exposed part of fabric for color fastness first, of course.) For cotton and linen — Pour boiling water from a height through stain; don't use soap. If stain is old, first rub well with glycer-ine, then use boiling water as above. All stains, regardless of cause, should be treated before laundering.
