### Harbor Hills Area Site Offered For New Junior College; Interest Of Board of Education Hinted

The latest proposed site for the Harbor district junior college, which the Board of Education formerly intended to locate on the edges of Bixby Slough is outside the city but might be annexed.

Dr. Harold L. Snow, San Pedro, has written to the Los Angeles City Council requesting information regarding procedure to have 30 acres of county territory land near Harbor Hills purchased as a proposed site. Snow said the site is "ideal" but that the board of education had requested the site be made a portion of the city "to avoid any possibility of the college being voted out of the school district."

He said in his letter to the council that it is proposed to connect the 30 acres to the city with a narrow strip of land about a mile long, which runs along the south side of Palos Verdes dr. north, a kind of a "shooting strip."

Snow indicated he owns at least a portion of the land offered. The city council referred the letter to its planning and water and power committees.

The proposed contract for the sale of the Torrance Municipal Bus Lines appears to be designed to benefit a certain individual or group who wish to acquire the bus lines at a time when, by reason of the expenditure by the City of Torrance of over \$75,000.00, out of the general funds of the City of Torrance, and the purchase and operation of new busses, the line transportation system and is now serving the needs of the residents of Torrance better than such needs have been served at any time heretofore. The purchase price of the bus lines is far below the present value of the property to be sold under the offered contract and there are no assurances that the residents of Torrance would gain any better service or even continue to receive as good service as they are now getting.

There has been no logical reason advanced for selling the bus lines at this time. The City Accountant's figures show that for several months past the City has been deriving an income of several thousand dollars per month from the operation of said transportation system. On such basis alone, the value of the lines should be correctly appraised at

according to present day standards, and if the lines are to be sold at all and taken out of the hands of the citizenry, a price of at least three times the present value should be received. There have been no other bids, no efforts to contact possible buyers have been made, and it seems to observers that this proposition was rushed through the Council on July 24th, 1945, by a three to two vote, without any opportunity for public discussion or the exercise of considered judgment. The voters of Torrance should exercise their right of ballot to preserve their municipal property and to retain for the City the transportation service that they have acquired with so much difficulty and arduous effort.
