## Clifford Kette Serving Aboard U. S. Sub Tender

Clifford D. Kette Jr., EM 2/c, U. S. Navy, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clifford D. Kette, 2333 W. 254th St., Lomita, is numbered among the crew of 900 Navy men aboard a U. S. submarine tender at an advanced Pacific base.

This repair vessel is charged with refitting war-weary submarines returning from combat patrol in the Pacific.

During a two-week repair period, while the submarine crews are enjoying rest camp relaxation, the sub tender personnel, hailed as unsung working men of the submarine fleet, will condition the underwater vessels for return to duty.

Guns are checked, unspent torpedoes removed and overhauled, engines pulled down and rebuilt. Repairs are extensive and these crews tear a submarine apart and virtually rebuild it in two weeks. Completely overhauled, the submarine is as mechanically perfect as the day it left the builder's yard.

Electrician's Mate Kette attended school in Lomita, graduating from Narbonne, class of winter '40 and enrolled at Los Angeles Trade School, where he spent a year learning the electrical trade. He was then employed by the Smallcomb Electric Co., Los Angeles, until he enlisted in the Navy, in May, 1943.

## Athlete's Foot Care and Cure Rules Simple

Athlete's foot is not caused by a germ like those which produce ordinary pus infections, but by a fungus, which when grown in the laboratory looks like a patch of white mold. This fungus is very hard to kill; but, since warmth and moisture favor its growth, dryness and coolness hinder it.

An early sign of athlete's foot is a tendency of the skin around or between the toes to crack, loosen and peel off. There is considerable itching and burning, and when the flakes of skin peel off they leave behind a red and somewhat sore surface.

In a considerable proportion of severe cases, the skin of the hands is also affected. Most skin specialists believe the hand condition is due to poisons carried in the blood to the hands from the fungus growth in the skin of the feet.

Because shoes and hose become contaminated and reinfect the feet again and again, a person with athlete's foot should wear only white cotton hose, changing every day, and make a 10-minute boiling period part of the laundry program.

It is advised that a talcum powder containing ten per cent of powdered boric acid be dusted thickly into the shoes. This, together with the frequent changing and proper laundering of the hose and keeping the feet as dry and cool as possible will discourage the growth of the fungus.

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## State Fair Employment Practices Act May Go On Ballot Next Year

Attorney-General Robert W. Kenny announced today that supporters of the fight for a state Fair Employment Practices Committee law are being asked to approve and finance the placing of a state FEPC initiative measure on the ballot in 1946.

Kenny, as honorary chairman of the Statewide Committee for a California Fair Employment Practices Commission, has sent a letter to all members and supporters of the committee, which backed A.B. 3, the state FEPC bill, at the recent session of the California State Legislature.

The letter, signed also by Bartley C. Crum, Northern California chairman, and Walter Wanger, Southern California chairman, noted the fight for A.B. 3 "which made a deep impression in Sacramento, even though it was unsuccessful in its main objective."

"We believe," the letter states, "that it is our duty to carry on this fight without slackening. We believe that preparations should now be begun to place this issue before the voters of the State in 1946, by collecting enough signatures to place the measure on the ballot."

Reasons for continuing the State FEPC campaign, in Kenny's view are:

(1) Our young men went to war for American democracy. Equality of opportunity is of the essence of our heritage.

(2) Reconversion, cutbacks, and layoffs are beginning to confront us with serious employment problems. These problems will be made infinitely worse, if they are infected with the poison of discriminatory hiring and firing.

(3) The minority groups joined wholeheartedly in working and fighting for victory. To subject them to discrimination now would be a mockery of our professed ideals."

Cost of waging a campaign to put the measure on the ballot and promote its passage is estimated at \$50,000. It will require printing of 15,000 petitions, securing of at least 200,000 signatures from registered voters and the carrying on of an intensive educational and publicity campaign.

Kenny also announced that meetings will be called soon in Northern and Southern California to outline the committee's plans.
