



Other methods give inadequate sterilization of these foodstuffs; food poisoning and botulism may develop. To be completely safe, boil home-canned corn and greens 20 minutes, all other vegetables, except tomatoes, meats, poultry and fish 10 minutes in an open kettle before asting or serving. Reboil leftovers same length of time before using. Such boiling will destroy botulinus poisoning if it should be present.
