## CARSON ST. BRIDGE TO BE CONSTRUCTED BY COUNTY

As plans are undertaken to construct a highway bridge over the Los Angeles river to serve Carson st., suggestion has been made in Torrance that efforts be undertaken to extend Carson st. from Madrona ave. west to Redondo Beach.

Completion of these two projects would mean that Carson st. would be a through highway from Redondo Beach and Torrance to Anaheim and Santa Ana.

Construction of the \$500,000 bridge over the Los Angeles river to serve Carson, Spring and 22nd sts., will begin as soon as economic conditions permit, it was announced by County Road Commissioner O. F. Cooley.

"This is our No. 1 bridge project," Cooley said.


