1st Lieutenant George E. Jacques, 21, husband of Mrs. Thelma Lou Jacques, 2716 El Dorado st., Torrance, is currently assigned to the AAF Redistribution Station No. 4 at Santa Ana Army Air Base.

Lt. Jacques, a B-17 bombardier in the 15th Air Force with 27 combat missions to his credit, entered the service on June 25, 1943 and went overseas in November, 1944. He has been awarded the Air Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, and the European theater ribbon with four battle stars.

At this redistribution station, an operation of the Personnel Distribution Command, combat returnees of the AAF receive complete medical examinations, classification interviews and reassignment to domestic stations of the Army Air Forces.

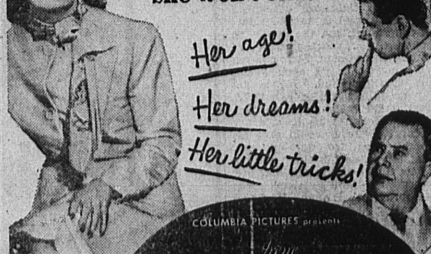
