With him at the bedside at the time of his death were his wife, Mrs. Maurine Conway Murray; a sister, Mrs. Margaret Bruder; his niece, Betty, Bruder, and Msgr. Nicholas Conneally, pastor of St. Monica's Parish.

Born Sept. 8, 1890, at Washburn, Wis., Mr. Murray came to Santa Monica in 1920 and established an automobile agency. Later he opened an agency in Torrance briefly and then returned to the beach city to conduct an automobile business.

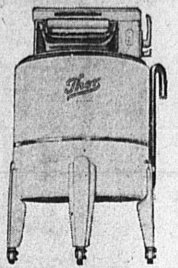

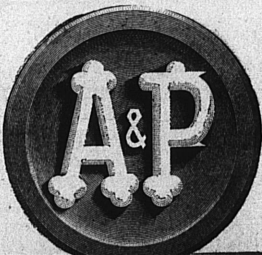

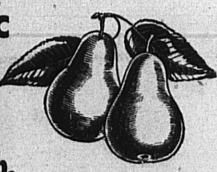
