

Child Care Centers to Be Discussed

Persons interested in continuing the extended day child care centers for working mothers have been invited to attend a mass meeting tonight, Thursday, at 8 o'clock, in Polytechnic high school, 400 W. Washington Blvd., Los Angeles.

It is expected that several Torrance people will attend the meeting, according to Mrs. Joy Prime, head teacher at the local center.

The centers have been operated by funds provided under the Lanham act and fees paid by the parents of children cared for, but the Lanham act money will be withdrawn as of Oct. 31.

Torrance City Council, at the request of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 3251 and the Lions Club have taken steps to have the League of California Cities do what it can to keep the centers in operation.

It is expected that the city will have a representative at the meeting.

Teacher Will Appeal L.A. School Case

Charles Eldred Ham, music teacher at Van Nuys high school, will appeal his teacher tenure case against the Los Angeles City High School district in the State Supreme Court, according to his Attorney, Wilfred Andrews.

Ham lost his suit in a decision by Superior Judge Robert H. Scott on June 11 in which his claims as a permanent teacher were denied and he was required to pay the school district \$879 court costs. It is the first teacher tenure suit to be appealed in Supreme Court, Andrews said.

The school district claims Ham is a temporary teacher on probation for permanency.
