

## State Aviation Project Committee Named as Special Legislature Looms

In anticipation of a call by Governor Earl Warren for a special session of the Legislature, Colonel Alexander R. Heron, State Director of Reconstruction and Reemployment has announced the appointment of a State Aviation Project Committee, which, in cooperation with the Assembly Airports and Aviation Interim Committee, will draft and recommend urgent legislation.

Lloyd Wright, Los Angeles attorney, who was chairman of the State Reconstruction and Reemployment Committee, will serve in the same position with the new committee.

In announcing the new committee membership, Colonel Heron said:

"The Commission's former committee on aviation developed and presented several measures to the 1945 regular legislative session. The presentation was made in full cooperation with the Assembly Aviation Interim Committee, of which Assemblyman William H. Rosenthal was chairman. For various reasons, the principal measures advocated were not enacted.

"The last session of the Legislature created a new interim committee to study airport projects and aviation. Assemblyman Ernest E. Debs of Los Angeles is chairman of this committee. It is planned to have the new State Aviation Project Committee work closely with this interim committee, making joint recommendations for urgent aviation legislation for presentation to the anticipated special session of the Legislature.

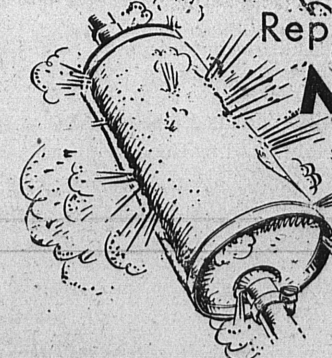

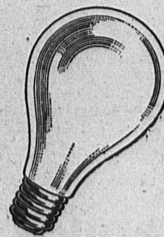
