The "Old Imperishable" of the Fleet had just completed a 32-day mission in the East China Sea to climax a career that began at Pearl Harbor, went through the Aleutians campaign, Normandy and Southern France invasions, and Two and Okinawa battles.

Her operations have included Marshall Islands, Wake Island, Marcus Island, Guadalcanal, Iwo Jima, Tarawaw, Wotje, Taroa, Battle of the Coral Sea, Tulagi and Misima Island, Funafuli, Aleutians, Matsuwa Island and Paramushiro Island, Chichi Jima, Haha Jima, Battle of Leyte Gulf in the Philippines, and operations in the East China Sea off Okinawa. The ship has credit for 33 bombardments and was in the first American Task Force to strike back at the Japs in the Marshall Islands after Pearl Harbor.
