Births Three Times Greater Than Deaths

Although the war baby peak in Los Angeles county was reached in 1943, stark visits outnumbered deaths in Torrance last year more than three to one, reports Dr. Henry C. Smiley, health officer. Births totaled 256 and deaths were 72.

Measles accounted for 56 of the 239 cases of communicable diseases in Torrance with mumps and chicken pox running second and third. There were 41 fewer cases of reportable diseases in Torrance this year than last.

Clinic attendance in the Torrance health district, which includes the City of Torrance, dropped off during the fiscal year just reported. This, in view of the increased population, reflects the improved financial status of the communities, health authorities believe. Clinic services totaled 17,695, which included tuberculosis 1,063; venereal disease control 4,206; and 1,772 visits to the maternal and child health clinics.

Seven of Los Angeles county's 409 rabid dogs were located in Torrance.

Torrance is one of 40 cities in Los Angeles county whose public health is under the direction of Dr. H. O. Swartout, health officer of the Los Angeles county health department.

Mr. and Mrs. Henry Moe, of 1516 W. 214th st., have returned from Arlington where they were called by the illness and death of their son, Clifford Henry Moe, 36.

The deceased is also survived by his wife, Alice, and two children, Barbara Yvonne, 10 and Leonard, 8, of Arlington; two sisters, Mrs. Earl W. Condeley, of San Pedro and Mrs. Monte Tucker of Avalon, Catalina Island.

A former Torrance resident, Clifford Moe attended elementary school here and prior to his illness he served as captain of the fire department at Arlington.

A coat with an asbestos glove which fire captain Moe invented in collaboration with Fire Chief Ray Allen, of Riverside, has proven a great asset in fire fighting. He had served as first-aid teacher in the Arlington Riverside area for the past four years, and was regarded as one of the most outstanding first-aid teachers in the southland.

Interment was at Olivewood Cemetery, Riverside.
