Cash Awaits **Vets Reenlisting**

Veterans who now reenlist for the regular army will hit the jackpot for sums up to one thousand dollars each, it was re-vealed yesterday, as Lt. H. A. Glover, commanding officer of the San Pedro Military Personned Service announced that the new-ly-passed "Voluntary Recruit-ment Act of 1945" has gone into effect.

300 for men with overseas service, and \$300 for men with overseas service.

Other payments now made to men who recenlist include bonuses of \$50 for each year of previous service, and travel pay of five cents per mile for each mile of travel from the place of reenlistment to the soldier's home, and return.

Lt. Glover predicted the new inducements would attract large numbers of ex-soldiers back into the ranks of peacetime Army. He pointed out that men now volunteering are permitted to select their own branch of service as well as the area in which they will serve. Men who reenlist, within 20 days of their discharge are also reappointed to their former Army rank.

Special benefits are also othrown into the pot for married men. By the new congressional act, family allowances will also be paid to anyone who now reenlists. Volunteers may enroll for periods of one year, 18 months, two years, and three years, and the benefits of the GI Bill of Rights are granted to all men now signing up for the Regular Army.
