

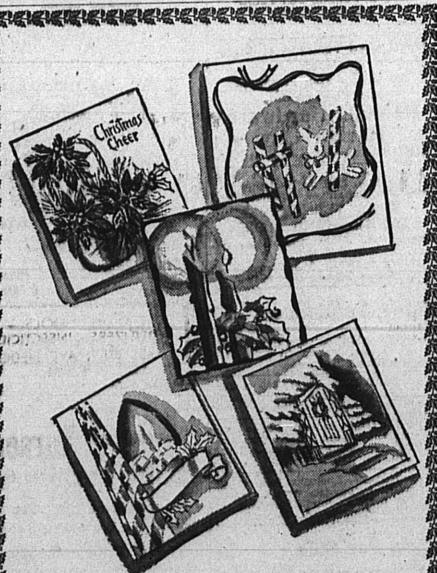
Full Regional Authority In WSC Sales Asked

In a move designed to simplify the sale of war surplus consumer goods in the Southern California region, the board of directors of the California State Chamber of Commerce, meeting in Los Angeles Friday, recommended to the U.S. Department of Commerce that its Los Angeles Surplus Property Office be granted full regional authority in the disposal of surplus consumer goods in this area. Action of the board was announced by E. C. Hummel, regional vice president and member of the board.

At the present time applications for purchase of surplus goods, sale of which has been much liberalized recently, cannot be cleared by the Los Angeles office but must be sent to the main Department of Commerce office in San Francisco. This results in much confusion and loss of time to Southern California would-be purchasers.

The move was also designed to help speed up disposal of surplus goods, huge stock piles of which are rapidly accumulating in the Southern California area. Figures presented to the board during discussion of the recommendation indicated that the unsold inventories on surplus consumer goods have multiplied five times in three months. In July value of goods on hand, unsold, was \$4,000,000. At the end of September the valuation of the rapidly accumulating goods had soared to \$20,000,000.
