U. S. Contributes To 25 Million War Victims

Henry J. Kaiser, national chairman of the Victory Clothing Collection, today announced the appointment of Dan A. West as executive director of the nationwide clothing drive for overseas relief in January.

West, who is Director of the Division of Contributed Supplies of UNRRA, was executive director of the April United National Clothing Collection and Mr. Kaiser was its national chairman. In this campaign, the American people contributed enough clothing, shoes and bedding to benefit 25,000,000 war victims in Europe, the Philippines, and China.

To help millions of other men, women and children in war-scarred lands, President Truman called upon Kaiser to head another national clothing drive. The goal in the Victory Clothing Collection, Jan. 7-31, is 100,000,000 serviceable used garments, in addition to shoes and bedding.

West reported that 6816 communities throughout America are already organizing local clothing drives under the direction of the 3258 men and women who have so far accepted appointments as local chairmen.

He also stated that Edward N. Scheiberling, of Indianapolis, shortly before his retirement as national commander of the American Legion last week called upon all Legion Post and Legion Auxiliary units to give utmost support to the Victory Clothing Collection and to offer the facilities of their Post clubhouses to local committees of the January clothing drive.

Health Office In Warning On Rabies

The County Health Department has sent out the following notice:

"Rabies is not a summer disease. With the advent of cooler weather many believe the necessity of treatment of dog bite wounds and the danger of rabies in animals or humans ceases to exist. The disease is primarily one of dogs, although all warm-blooded animals and man are susceptible to rabies. The manner or type of feeding the animal and extremely hot weather will not cause your dog to develop rabies. The mild climate of Los Angeles county which keeps dogs out of doors and constantly mingling with one another, is the primary cause of continuous, all-round vigilance to control rabies.

"The disease is caused by a filtrable virus contained in the saliva of the infected animal, and is primarily spread by the infected animal biting another, although it may spread by the saliva containing the virus getting into any open wound.

"Evidence has been presented which shows the virus of rabies may be present in the saliva of the animal from 3 to 8 days prior to the time clinical symptoms of rabies are noted. The animal will usually die in 3 to 6 days after symptoms are noted.

"Any person bitten by any animal is advised to consult his physician or the district health officer relative to proper treatment, and to give the name of the animal's owner. The Los Angeles County Health Department has trained inspectors who will follow up cases and place the animal under quarantine and observation on the premises of the owner.

"Regulations under State laws and L. A. County ordinance require a minimum observation period of 15 days of any animal biting a human, and a minimum quarantine period of 90 days of any animal bitten or

Old Papers Still Needed, Says Salvage Head

"Although scarcities and rationing are fast becoming words of the past, we still must remember that there is a critical shortage of paper."

With these words Fred Tabery, Los Angeles war salvage chief, urged residents yesterday to continue saving newspapers and magazines for school children who are conducting paper drives.

"Our Boy Scouts and parent-teacher associations are doing an excellent job of conducting school paper drives successfully but they need the public's co-operation," Tabery pointed out. Supplies still are being shipped overseas to servicemen. All these are sent in paper wrappings or cardboard cartons. It is essential that our G.I.'s receive such necessary items as food, clothing and medicine.

"We can help in this task," Tabery said, "if we save our old newspapers and magazines for the government."

Treatment Of Scabies New Topic

In the past, Danish ointment and a plain 10 or 15 per cent sulfur ointment have been the most commonly used preparations in treating scabies. Special preparations are sometimes available, in which the sulfur is present in combination with other substances that can be worked up into a foam or lather.

In any case, the treatment should be begun by taking a warm bath, scrubbing the skin thoroughly with tincture of green soap and a soft brush or coarse wash cloth. If an ointment is to be used, rub it thoroughly into every affected part of the skin, morning and evening, for three days. Do not change clothing or bedding during this period. After three days, take a warm cleansing bath and change both clothing and bedding. Wait one week to see whether or not the itching has been relieved, then repeat the treatment if necessary. The ointments may be irritating enough to cause itching for a few days, even though the itch mites have all been killed.

A remedy that has recently been found to be effective is a 25 per cent emulsion of benzyl benzoate. After the preliminary bath and scrubbing, the emulsion should be applied vigorously to the entire skin area from the neck down, using a brush or coarse wash cloth and taking about five minutes for the application. Let the emulsion dry on, then repeat the application. After 24 hours, take a cleansing bath and put on clean clothing. Sterilize all contaminated or infested clothing and bedding by boiling in water for ten minutes.

Terrific Cost Of World War Is Reported

World War II is estimated to have cost more than a trillion dollars, the California Taxpayers' Association has disclosed. The figure given was \$1,003,281,000,000.

The United States' share was \$287,181,000,000 of the estimated Allied expenditures of \$579,485,000,000. Total Axis expenditures were estimated at \$347,404,000,000.

Occupation costs during the war were set at \$37,392,000,000, with unknown expenditures at 40 billion dollars.

According to the figures

given, the United States bore about 28 to 30 per cent of the total cost of all war expenditures.

The CTA also revealed that while World War II was far more costly than World War I, the rise in the cost of living in the United States during and immediately following the second World War was only about half that of the earlier war. This was attributed to a great extent to price controls.

Inflationary forces which may have been dammed up during the war period just ended could easily explode with a greater force in the transition period than in the 1920's, the CTA report stated. It was pointed out that the peak of the cost of living after World War I was not reached until 1920.
