While control of the Torrance \$4663.30; Beacon Drug Co. sta-Municipal bus lines in the sub-ject of much controversy within 96, and miscellaneous revenue Municipal bus lines in the sub-ject of much controversy within the City Hall, the lines, under the management of C. Z. Ward, continue to make good money for the city, reports reveal. It is estimated that the bus lines are making a "net profit" of seven cents per mile. The monthly gross of the lines has been ranging from \$11,000 to \$12,000 per month. November figures show that the lines took in a total of \$12,0623 A. St he lines traveled 33,528 miles, this a gross reve-nue of about 36 cents per mile.

mue of about 36 cents per mile.

Manager Ward declares that, including depreciation, the cost of operation of the lines runs from 25 to 28 cents per mile.

While endorsing the idea that the Sunset Stages operate a line from Redondo Beach to Torrance, the City of Torrance is considering establishing a service to North Torrance.

Laboring under the theory that the bus lines are not intended to "make money" but to serve the people, the majority of the council now in control of the department states that it is willing to venture into new field, utilizing the profits to give better service.

Meanwhile, the question of the sale of the lines to C. R. Koors is the subject of a Superior court suit, and a hearing for a new trial, on petition of the city, is set for Dec. 21, tomor-row.
