"If the governments of the world would read what is in the hearts of people, they would see that what the people desires most is a better way of life and to live at peace with their neighbors," Warren said.

The Governor declared that the United States, having "loosed-the force of atomic energy in order to put an end to the worst war in history," must accept the responsibility for creating moral forces that will prevent its use in the future.

Counteracting forces, he said must include good will, self-discipline and belief in the fatherhood of God and the brother-hood of man.
