Calling upon California to "get production and employment going at full capacity" to pro-vide jobs for both veteran and non-veteran, U.S. Senator Wil-liam F. Knowland reported this week from Washington that there were 852,000 veterans of World War II in California on April 1.

week from vasinington that there were 82,000 veterans of World War II in California on April 1. Knowland declared that 632. O00 of the veterans, now resid-ing in California, entered ser-vice from this state, and that 220,000 came from other states. "This number will grow as demobilization of our forces con-tinues," the Senator said. "These men want jobs and not blue-prints or promises." Adding that these returned veterans also want to see provisions made for the widows and orphans of their comrades who fell in the war. Knowland said that all of these things could be provided "if we get production and employment go-ing at full capacity." Production, he declared, will keep America strong "so that we may play our full part in seeing to it that no future agressor is allowed to disturb the peace of the world, for we want our children to live in a world free from the threat of atomic war or the tyranny of dictatorial government over the bodies and minds of men." Knowland pointed out that there must be no cleavage be-tween veteran and non-veteran because 'no segment of our population can prosper for long while other segments are in want."

FPHA Blanket Freeze Stops Vets' Buildings

Thousands of veterans can't build or finish homes in this area because the Federal Pub-lic Housing Authority has put a blanket 'freeze'' on vast guan-tities of surplus construction materials. That

lie Housing Authority has put a blanket "freeze" on vast quan-tities of surplus construction materials. That was the protest made yesterday by the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce in a wire to Wilson Wyait, national housing expediter, urging him to break the wholesale "freeze" of materials by F.P.H.A. "While the Federal Housing Administration here has issued 40,000 redience priorities to yet-erans and builders, these are merely hunting licenses because the F.P.H.A. has frozen prac-tically all surplus building ma-terials," said Carleton B. Tib-betts, emergency housing and construction materials committee chairman, in a report to the chamber board. The directors approved de-termined action to prevent F.P. H.A. from freezing all available War Assets Administration sur-pluses of critical building ma-terials, and that F.P.H.A. be forced to relazes a fair percentage of the permanent-type materials al-ready frozen.
