Lieut. Slover One Of Authors Of Navy Book

Leonard Vorhis, 28, son of Mr. and Mrs. Don Vorhis, died Saturday, May 18, in the U. S. Naval hospital, in Long Beach, where he had been a patient for two months. The young U. S. Army sergeant who was given a medical discharge from the Army in March of this year, was born in Torrance and had resided here all of his life. He served as a platon sergeant in Co. H. 2nd Battallon, 39th Regisant Gallorina State Guard, up to the time of his induction-into the federal service.

Vorhis was born in Torrance in 1917, and is the father of Carol Lynne Vorhis, of Long Beach, age 4. Also surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Don Vorhis; two brothers, Charles, of Torrance and Norval of Gardena; two sisters, Dorothy, of Torrance, and Mrs. Hazel Kyte, of Torrance.


