Called together by Sheriff Biscailuz, police chiefs and representatives of 45 cities in Los Angeles county met recently to wage a vigorous campaign against the mounting dangers of illegal flying.

The Army Air Forces, the Navy, the District Attorney's office and the Civil Aeronautics Administration and Board were represented at the Hall of Justice luncheon which resulted in the naming of a special committee to study and report on ways and means to end "flat hatting."

Capt. Dave Andrews of the Sheriff's grime prevention bureau suggested the group study means of controlling "unscrupulous, small-time operators who are permitting youngsters of 13, 14 and 15 to take up planes without bothering to ascertain if they even have a license."

Superior Judge A. A. Scott advised: "If we haven't the laws to control this situation, let's get the laws."
