**Stories Of Early Americans'** Lives

A new type of "industry show," the present exhibition was planned and installed by a committee including members of the oxhibit staff of the build ing and members of the Society of the Plastics industry. It de-parts from the usual industrial exhibitions in that it was plan-ned from the consumers view-point and depicts the industry from the laboratory to the fin-ished article. The sources of mechanical processes that turn ecal and wood, pubp and milk into nylons and machine parts and hairbrushes. Adjoining the Collseum and the Rose Garden in Exposition Park, the building is open to the pub-lie from noon until 5 p.m. ev-ery day except Monday. Admis-sion is free.
