Providing for the bonding of Torrance property to the ex-tent of \$1,550,000, the City Council Tuesday night adopted averance property to the ex-tent of \$1,550,000, the City Council Tuesday night adopted resolution No. 1780, which de-clares the public convenience and necessity requires the rais-ing of funds not available from taxation, as follows: Trunk sanitary severs, \$350, 000; storm drains for drain-age of surface, storm and flood waters, \$95,000; fire sta-tions and training tower in-cluding acquisition of all land, apparatus, equipment, furni-ture and furnishings, \$125,000; reconstruction of central fire station as nolles withon arc apparatus, equipment, furni-ture and furnishings, \$125,000; reconstruction of central fire station as police station and municipal court building and construction of additions, in-ciuding furnishings, etc., \$60, 000; grading, paving, surfac-ing and resurfacing of streets and alleys, \$400,000; recrea-tion facilities including the ac-public station and construction of buildings, a ball park stadium, pedestrian tunnel beneath the Sanfa Fe raliway; filumination of parks and playgrounds, ac-quisition of land, rights of way, furniture, furnishings, ap-paratus and equipment, \$480, 000; a water main, including valves, fittings, etc. \$40,000. It is the proposal of the City of Torrance that the bond issue be submitted to the voters on August 20.
