It will also require hot dog stands to comply with all health requirements which are imposed on restaurants; require all grocery stores, markets and other food dispensing establishments to obtain a permit from the County Health Department; increase the fee of a hawker's permit from 50c to 50; require all roadside stands selling food stuffs, except produce raised on the premises, to meet all requirements imposed on grocery stores and markets; prevent hawkers from parking their vehicles in any one place more than thirty minutes; and require poultry and rabbit slaughter jours and walls of plaster or other similar substances.
