County Agricultural Commission is asking housekeepers, storekeepers and others who may have in their possession weet potatoes purchased since the first of June, to examine them to determine if the sweet potatoes are infested with weevils.

The commissioner asked all persons who find their sweet potatoes to be infested to report to his office, or to the local agricultural inspector, at once. Cooperating with the Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantine of the State Department of Agriculture, the commission said that if weevils are found they may be sweet potato weevils, a serious pest in certain Southern states but not generally established in California. The State Department of Agriculture informed the commission hat it suspects that sweet potato weevils may have been prought into California in parts for recent shipments from out of state areas presumed to be free from the pest and from lots so certified.
