These are all foods which can be stored for winter use either dry (sweet corn and beans), or canned or frozen (sweet corn or beans; yes, sweet potatoes and squash too), or can be stored as they come from the plants for winter use (dry beans, sweet potatoes and squash). 



U. S. Merchant Marine and ap-ply for appointment as cadet-midshipmen in the U. S. Mer-chant Marine Cadet Corps must have their applications post-marked not later than October 1, 1946, in order to be con-sidered for the next entrance examination of November 6, 1946. Seniors scheduled to be grad-uated in January or February 1947, with insufficient scholastic units when the application is submitted, will be permitted to take the November examination subject to satisfactory comple-tion of studies in progress. Youths 16½ to 21 years of age and armed force veterans to the age of 24 may apply. Can-Youths 18% to 21 years to age and armed force veterans to the age of 24 may apply. Can-didates who complete the train-ing will be qualified for a li-cense as a deck or engineer officer in the U.S. Merchant Marine and a commission as Ensign, U.S. Marilme Service, and Ensign, U.S. Naval Re-serve, upon being graduated from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, The four year train-ing course includes one year at sea on a merchant or train-ing ship.
