His ship was torpedoed off the Solomon Islands in the early stages of the war, and Moore and his shipmates were under fire both from surface guns and aircraft. He was hospitalized in Sydney, Australia and had 65 pieces of shrapnel removed from his legs. He is shown in dungarees shortly after his promotion to chief in 1943. He worked at Doak Aircraft while on rehabilitation leave and is shown in a gay mood sporting his campaign ribbons and employees badge.
