Torrance Turns Down County Bond Issues

Torrance had its hand in turning down the county board issues, it is revealed by complete but unofficial returns from local combined precincts.
While several of the seven propositions which total \$44,000,000 were given a simple majority on a county-wide basis, it was indicated, Torrance failed to even accord that concession. The bonds required a two-thirds majority.

The vote was extremely light, with but 615, voters going to the six combined polling places provided for the election.
This represented slightly more than 11 percent of the total registration of Torrance.
The vote in Lomita was similar to that in Torrance and on a county-wide basis, except that Lomita voters favored the ju venile hall bonds by the necessary two-thirds majority.
