The most unusual thing is that a large stone, when cut, will have one type of design and color on one side and an entirely different one on the other. The history of the stones is as interesting as the hobby. Spratt has collected stones from many of the nearby beaches and des-erts and explains that the colors and designs found in the stones are the result of gas pockets
