Price Advance In Los Angeles Area Reported By Govt. At 5.6 Percent

Prices of living essentials in average food prices in Los Angeles area are now only 1.9 percent lower than they were at the peak of the inflation in June 1945.

Average prices of clothing and housefurnishings rose 0.7 percent between May and June, with consumers paying higher prices for shoes, shirts, shoe repairs, bedroom and living room sets and sheets and towels.

The sharp rises in retail prices covered both the period immediately before the suspension of price controls and the 15-day period from July 1 to 15, when all controls were removed.

Higher prices for bread, milk, butter and eggs, which together account for more than a quarter of all family expenditures for food, were mainly responsible for a 2.7 percent jump in average food prices between May and June.

With the removal of controls on July 1, food prices soared another 10.6 percent with a 29 percent hike in meat prices mainly responsible for the increase.

LANDLORDS NAMED IN OPA RENTS SUITS

OPA went all out in its efforts to enforce compliance with rent regulations when a total of eight suits seeking treble damages aggregating \$5,861.97 from Southland landlords were filed in State and Federal courts by the agency's rent attorneys.

SEKINGS

The suits, affecting six Los Angeles metropolitan district and two San Diego county properties, charged collection of over-ceiling rents or failure to register rental property and refusal to refund over-payment to tenants.
