Use Of Sewage Effluent To Solve West Basin Water Crisis Outlined

There is no incurable reason¥or ny sewage effluent cannot be led to solve the West Basin's we used to critical water problem.

critical water problem. Conceding a popular, if ground-less, prejudice against this idea, R. F. Goudey, chief sanitary en-gineer of the Los Angeles De-partment of Water and Power, has just completed the first de-tailed study of this oft-discussed reclamation possibility. His find-ings are embodied in an over-all report prepared by Harold Conking, top-ranking hydraulic engineer, for the West Basin Water Association. As of sewage effluent is being discharged daily into Santa Monica Bay. If rectified this waste would provide far more than forescable needs for water throughout the West Basin. As Engineer Goudey views it such a solution of the West Basin water problems are politi-cal raper than techned. As an engineering fact saw-age water is already being rec-fund a broad. In a 56-mile stretch of the Ruhr River in 1921, similar waters, serving three and one-half millions of people, were put through three cycles of reuse. At Rockville Center, Long Island, sewage is spread into surface basins to replenish underground water supplies. A dozen other cases from Maryland to California are citted in the Goudey report. 


